BIOGRAPHY

Matthew Wachtman is an active organist and collaborative musician from Defiance, Ohio. He currently serves as Organist at St. Mark's United Methodist Church in Bloomington, Indiana. Beginning at age 12, he served as Organist and Music Director at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Defiance. Matthew is currently earning the Master of Music degree in Organ Performance at Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music, where he studies with Dr. Christopher Young. He received the Bachelor of Music degree in Keyboard Performance at Baldwin Wallace University Conservatory of Music under the tutelage of Nicole Keller. Matthew has performed in masterclasses with Chelsea Chen, Dr. Timothy Olsen, Alan Morrison, and Todd Wilson and is regularly invited to play recitals on prominent concert series throughout the Midwest. Matthew earned first prize in the 2019 AGO/Quimby Young Organist Competition held in Cleveland, and was also the winner of the undergraduate prize in the 2020 Immanuel Luther-an Church Organ Scholar Competition in Evanston, IL.

Jinhee Kim is originally from Seoul, South Korea. As the daughter of a choral and orchestral conductor, pursuing a career in organ performance and church music came naturally to her. Kim has performed in numerous recitals and concerts as a soloist and with instrumentalists, singers, and orchestra. Kim was the first prize winner of the San Marino National Organ Competition and was cited as a finalist in the Asia Organ Competition in Taipei, Taiwan and the Longwood Gardens International Organ Competition. As Associate Instructor at Indiana University (IU), Kim taught Elective and Secondary Organ and conducted studio classes. A doctoral candidate at IU, Kim also completed a master's degree in Organ Performance and Literature at Indiana University Jacobs School of Music. She earned her Artist Diploma in Organ Performance at Oberlin Conservatory of Music and holds a bachelor's degree in Organ from Yonsei University in Seoul, South Korea where she graduated summa cum laude. Her organ teachers include Christopher Young, James Christie, Olivier Latry, Tong-Soon Kwak, and Ji-yoen Choi. Kim currently serves as Director of Music and Organist at Grace Lutheran Church in Columbus, Indiana.
